## The Burden of Diabetes in MARYLAND

## Diabetes is a huge problem in the United States.

More than 30 million Americans have diabetes and face its devastating consequences. What's true nationwide is also true in Maryland.


Approximately $\mathbf{6 3 8}, \mathbf{0 0 0}$ people in Maryland or $\mathbf{1 2 . 8 \%}$ of the adult population, have diabetes. Of these, an estimated 156,000 have diabetes and don't know it, greatly increasing their health risk.


1,634,000 people in Maryland have prediabetes - a condition in which blood glucose levels are higher than normal but not high enough to be diagnosed with diabetes.


Every year, an estimated 28,000 people in Maryland are diagnosed with diabetes.


Diabetes is expensive. People with diabetes have medical expenses approximately 2.3 times higher than those who do not have diabetes.


Diagnosed diabetes costs an estimated $\$ 7$ billion in Maryland each year.
